



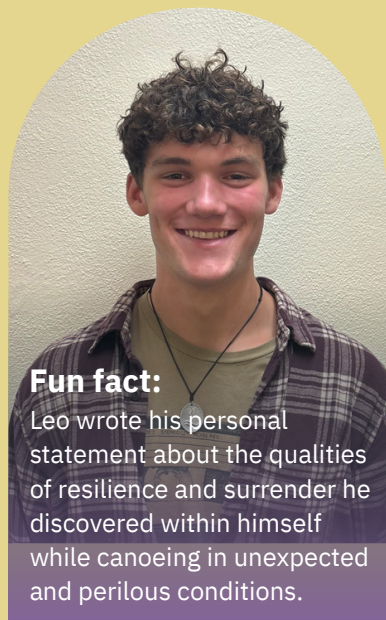
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Student Spotlight

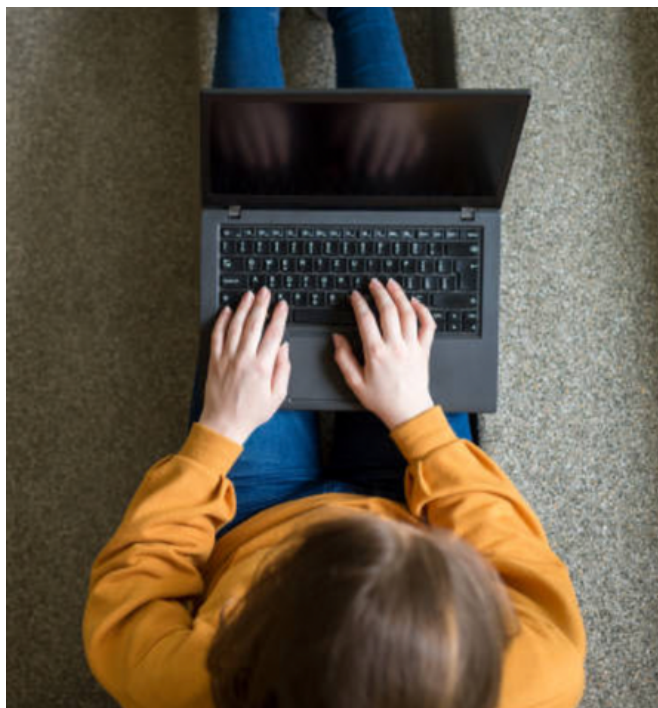

- Complete ACT/SAT testing before school starts
- Finalize your college list before school starts





Getting Ready for College

Pro Tips for Campus Visits

The college search process is a time for discovery and learning. Once you've done the preliminary research to determine which schools you want to visit, it's time to sign up for tours and information sessions. In the "Admissions" section of each school's website, there will be opportunities to do so.

The primary goal of these visits is to make sure that the campus—which includes its vibe, professors, student population, amenities, facilities, and local surroundings—would be a good place to explore your academic interests, pursue extracurriculars, and develop new relationships.

A secondary goal of the visit is to let the school know that you are on campus visiting – that you are exhibiting what they call "demonstrated interest." Not all schools include demonstrated interest as a factor in the admissions process, but there's no downside to signaling your interest in attending. Be sure to register for an official tour and info sessions; don't just walk around on your own. You'll learn more this way (which will be helpful when it comes time to make decisions), and the school will see that you made the effort to come learn about them in person... **keep reading**

Applications 101

How to Write Your College Essay

Advice from PTP Writing Coach Kyle Lopez

While we can't guarantee your college admissions outcomes, we can promise that if you follow our advice, you'll have the foundation for a great college essay. It may take longer than you hope and be more work than you imagine, but our tips are proof that your essay will be its strongest with some strategy and planning ahead.

Your main goal for the Common Application essay should be to come across as specific, authentic, and clear. One of the easier traps to fall into is overthinking whether you seem "impressive" enough and then letting that drive your writing. Admissions officers read hundreds, if not thousands, of essays, and what stands out is a sense that a real person is speaking honestly about something that is personally important to them.

Start by figuring out a topic that... **keep reading**

Warren Wilson College Swannanoa, NC

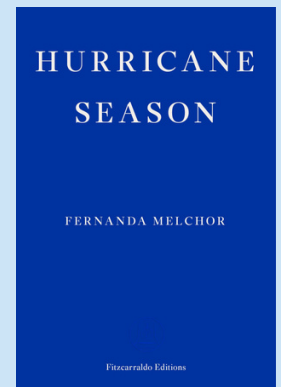
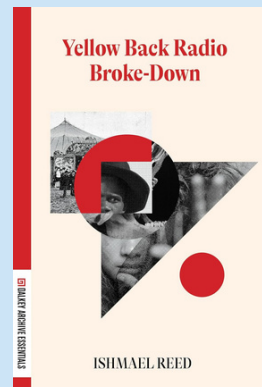
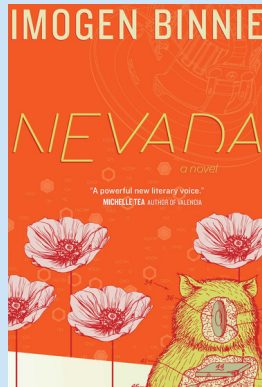
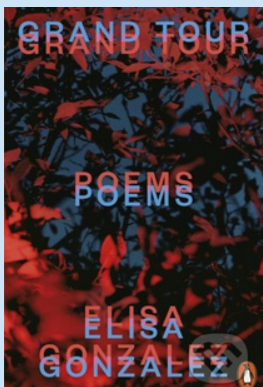
